Motivation crowding theory is the theory from psychology and microeconomics suggesting that providing extrinsic incentives for certain kinds of behavior—such as promising monetary rewards for accomplishing some task—can sometimes undermine intrinsic motivation for performing that behavior. The result of lowered motivation, in contrast with the predictions of neoclassical economics, can be an overall decrease in the total performance. CROWDING EFFECTS ON INTRINSIC MOTIVATION

Intrinsic motivation is assumed to be an exogenously given constant, and often it is completely disregarded. Motivation crowding theory tries to mediate between standard economic thinking based on purely extrinsic motivation and psychological theories by stipulating a systematic interaction between extrinsic and intrinsic motivation.

The definition of "motivation crowding out" in economic research includes any effect that is opposite to the relative price effect of standard economic theory: rewards decreasing behavior levels, and penalties increasing behavior levels.

Intrinsic motivation has been one of the most studied non-monetary incentives within BE. 2, 3, 4 BE has established that monetary rewards and intrinsic motivation interact sometimes as substitutes (when incentives adversely affect agents' intrinsic motivation), and sometimes as complements (when incentives positively affect agents' intrinsic motivation). 3 BE calls the former the crowding-out effect and the latter the crowding-in effect.

When Extrinsic Incentives Displace Intrinsic Motivation ...

The overjustification effect occurs when an expected external incentive such as money or prizes decreases a person's intrinsic motivation to perform a task. The overall effect of offering a reward for a previously unrewarded activity is a shift to extrinsic motivation and the undermining of pre-existing intrinsic motivation.
